THE CONFESSION AND ABSOLUTION

- "Long ago, at many times and in many ways, God spoke to our fathers by the prophets" and the apostles. Tonight, we hear the words of the apostle Peter. Encouraging steadfastness of faith, he spoke of the day of the Lord coming like a thief in the night. It is a timeless message as we abide in the anticipation of the appearance of the Christ. Thus, let us heed the voice of the apostle, confessing our sin so as to be prepared when the Christ appears.
- Lord Jesus, You have fulfilled the words of the prophets which prepared the world for Your Incarnation.
- We thank and praise You for this visitation by which You have saved us from our sin by Your birth, life, death and resurrection.
- Lord Jesus, You have promised through the words of the apostles which prepares the world for Your return.
- We thank and praise You for the hope that we have in that day when You will deliver us from the brokenness of this world.
- Lord Jesus, bless us with Your Spirit so that we may abide in true repentance, being ever ready that day when You shall appear.
- We confess before You our sinfulness and that we are not truly prepared for Your appearance. Our thoughts have not been of You; our deeds have not shown love for You or others; our words have been callous and uncaring. Lord, we repent of our sin. Forgive us and send Your Holy Spirit to produce in us works in keeping with repentance.
- P Upon this your confession, I, by virtue of my office as a called and ordained servant of the Word, announce the grace of God unto all of you, and in the stead and by the command of my Lord Jesus Christ I forgive you all your sins in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit.

Keep us watchful, sober-minded and steadfast in courage as we face daily trial and temptation to the end that when Your Son comes we may truly rejoice in being delivered from this sin-broken world; through Jesus Christ, Your Son our Lord, who lives and reigns with You and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever.

THE OLD TESTAMENT LESSON

Leviticus 19:9-18

⁹ "When you reap the harvest of your land, you shall not reap your field right up to its edge, neither shall you gather the gleanings after your harvest. ¹⁰ And you shall not strip your vineyard bare, neither shall you gather the fallen grapes of your vineyard. You shall leave them for the poor and for the sojourner: I am the LORD your God.

¹¹ "You shall not steal; you shall not deal falsely; you shall not lie to one another. ¹² You shall not swear by my name falsely, and so profane the name of your God: I am the LORD.

¹³ "You shall not oppress your neighbor or rob him. The wages of a hired worker shall not remain with you all night until the morning. ¹⁴ You shall not curse the deaf or put a stumbling block before the blind, but you shall fear your God: I am the LORD.

¹⁵ "You shall do no injustice in court. You shall not be partial to the poor or defer to the great, but in righteousness shall you judge your neighbor. ¹⁶ You shall not go around as a slanderer among your people, and you shall not stand up against the life of your neighbor: I am the LORD.

¹⁷ "You shall not hate your brother in your heart, but you shall reason frankly with your neighbor, lest you incur sin because of him. ¹⁸ You shall not take vengeance or bear a grudge against the sons of your own people, but you shall love your neighbor as yourself: I am the LORD.

Romans 13:8-10

⁸ Owe no one anything, except to love each other, for the one who loves another has fulfilled the law. ⁹ For the commandments, "You shall not commit adultery, You shall not murder, You shall not steal, You shall not covet," and any other commandment, are summed up in this word: "You shall love your neighbor as yourself." ¹⁰ Love does no wrong to a neighbor; therefore love is the fulfilling of the law.

Matthew 22:34-40

³⁴ But when the Pharisees heard that he had silenced the Sadducees, they gathered together. ³⁵ And one of them, a lawyer, asked him a question to test him. ³⁶ "Teacher, which is the great commandment in the Law?" ³⁷ And he said to him, "You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your mind. ³⁸ This is the great and first commandment. ³⁹ And a second is like it: You shall love your neighbor as yourself. ⁴⁰ On these two commandments depend all the Law and the Prophets."
